#### • First: The Text Book Reading

Before reading the text, lets go through some procedures which may facilitate the difficulties of the text:

- Preview text (that means read the title and try to get any information in your mind about it "use your prior knowledge".
- Skim for important ideas (that means reading quickly using your eyes just to get the general idea of the text without concerning with details)
- Read the questions.
- Text highlight (you highlight the important details that help you answer the questions)
- Try to get the important vocabularies in the text.
- Connect text to background knowledge.
- Connect one part to a text to another.
- Guess the meaning of words from context.
- Take notes.
- Try to make your summarize from the notes taken.
- Answer the questions.

Now read the two texts.


• Take notes of important points.

#### Direct and Indirect objects


ndirect object( without to/for)+ direct object


Use *To* with:

pass, post, sell, send, show

When the direct object is a pronoun, you should put the pronoun first

Use *For* with:
Book, buy, choose, cook, find, get, make, order, save
